

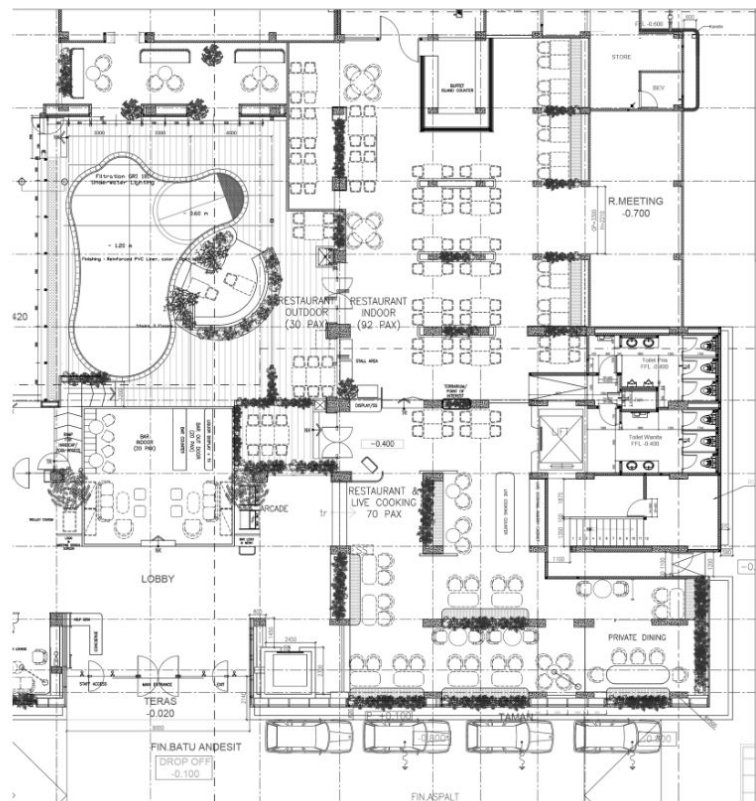

Situated at the heart of Jakarta, Clovia restaurant is a renovation project of the existing Mercure Hotel restaurant to meet the increasing demand for capacity as it is always full daily.

The name "Clovia" is a play on the word "clove," a spice indigenous to Indonesia. This concept will draw inspiration from the rich heritage of Indonesian spices and the warm, inviting atmosphere of a traditional Indonesian home. The restaurant features a contemporary Indonesian style, combining traditional elements with modern design. Warm and inviting colors are chosen, with earthy tones like brown, green, and terracota color. Natural materials, such as wood combined with greeneries variations, are used extensively to create a sense of warmth and comfort.

The room features key tile accents that depict traditional elements, evoking the warmth of Jakarta vintage houses. These are combined with contemporary elements such as traditional terracotta tiles and modern decorative pieces. This combination creates the impression that traditional elements can be paired with modern materials and presented in a contemporary way.

The name Clovia is emphasized through a mural featuring a clove illustration painted on various spots of the restaurant walls. Brown and warm colors with green accents represent the clove, while rattan accessories and wooden elements add warmth to the room, creating a cozy and natural atmosphere.
