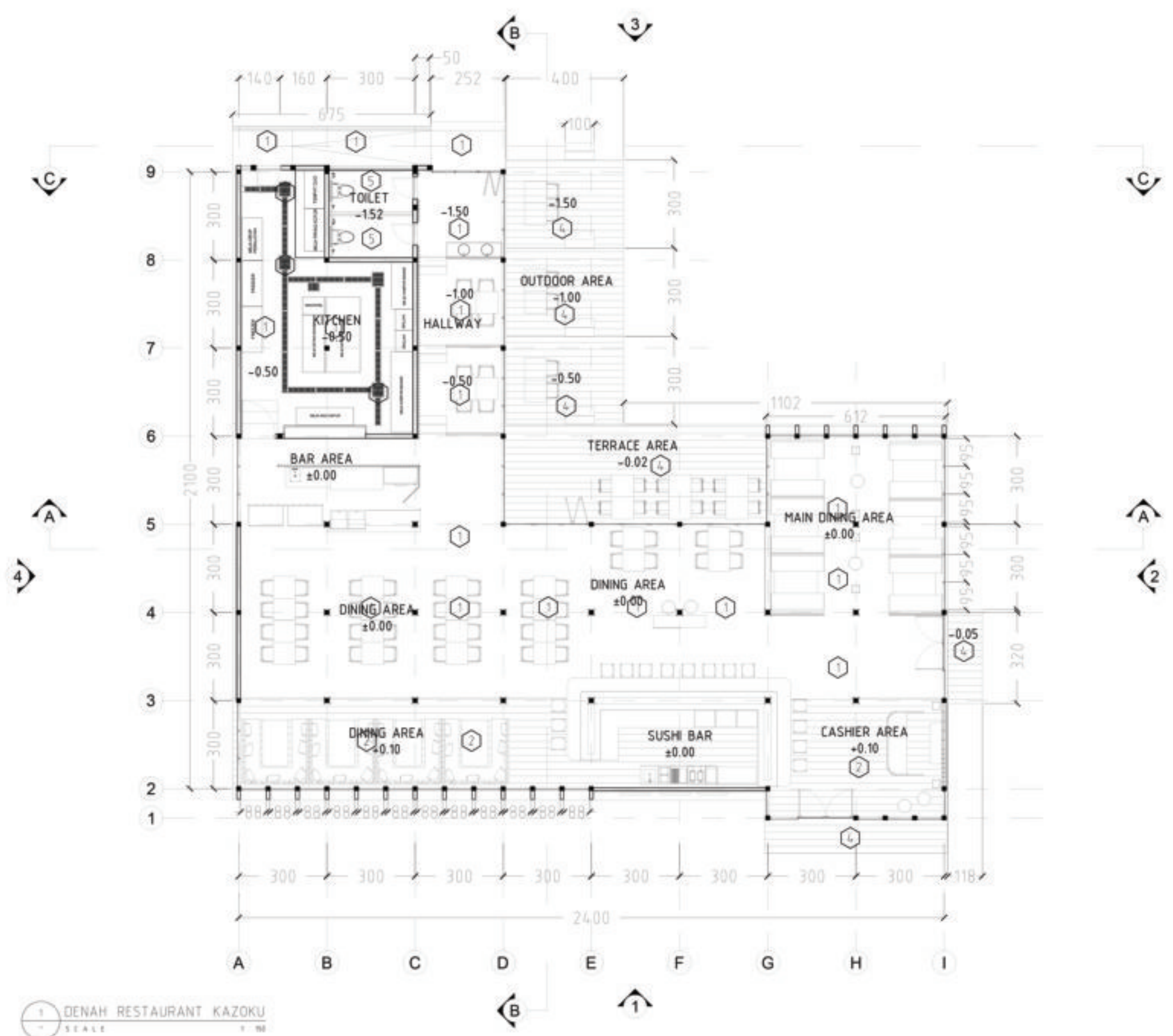


KAZOKU TEI

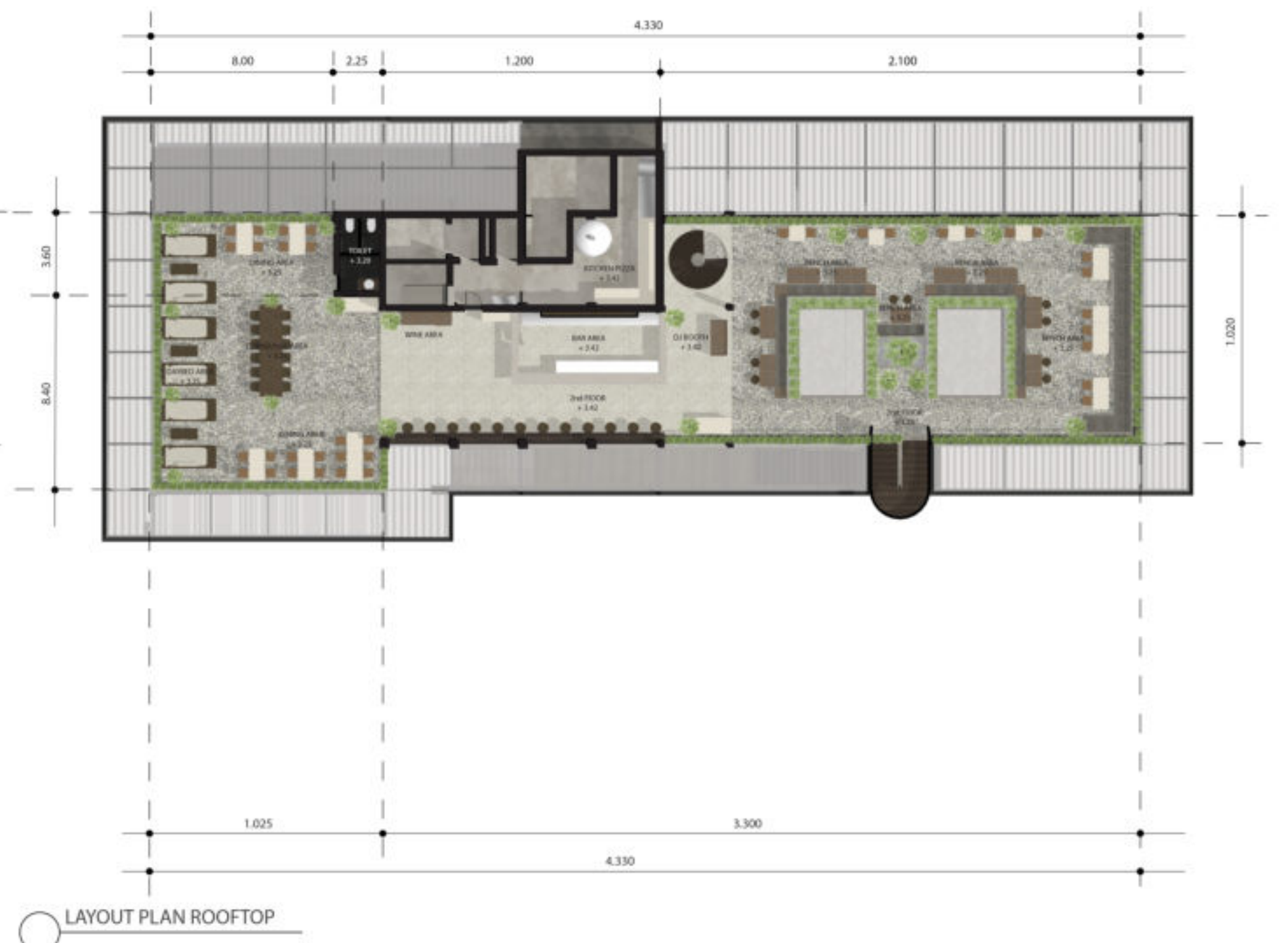

Le Bajo, a renowned café originally based in Melbourne, has expanded to Bali, Indonesia. Located in Pantai Lima Pererenan, Bali, Le Bajo combines a restaurant, bar, and concept store with a fresh design that merges modern elements with Balinese aesthetics.

Covering 500 square meters, the design emphasizes rustic elegance. The dining room seats around 200 guests, featuring cabanas by the pool and a concept shop at the front of the building.

These spaces seamlessly blend modern design elements with natural materials and greenery, creating an environment that harmonizes with its natural surroundings. The use of wood, stone, and plants ties each area together, ensuring the interior design flows effortlessly with the surrounding landscape.



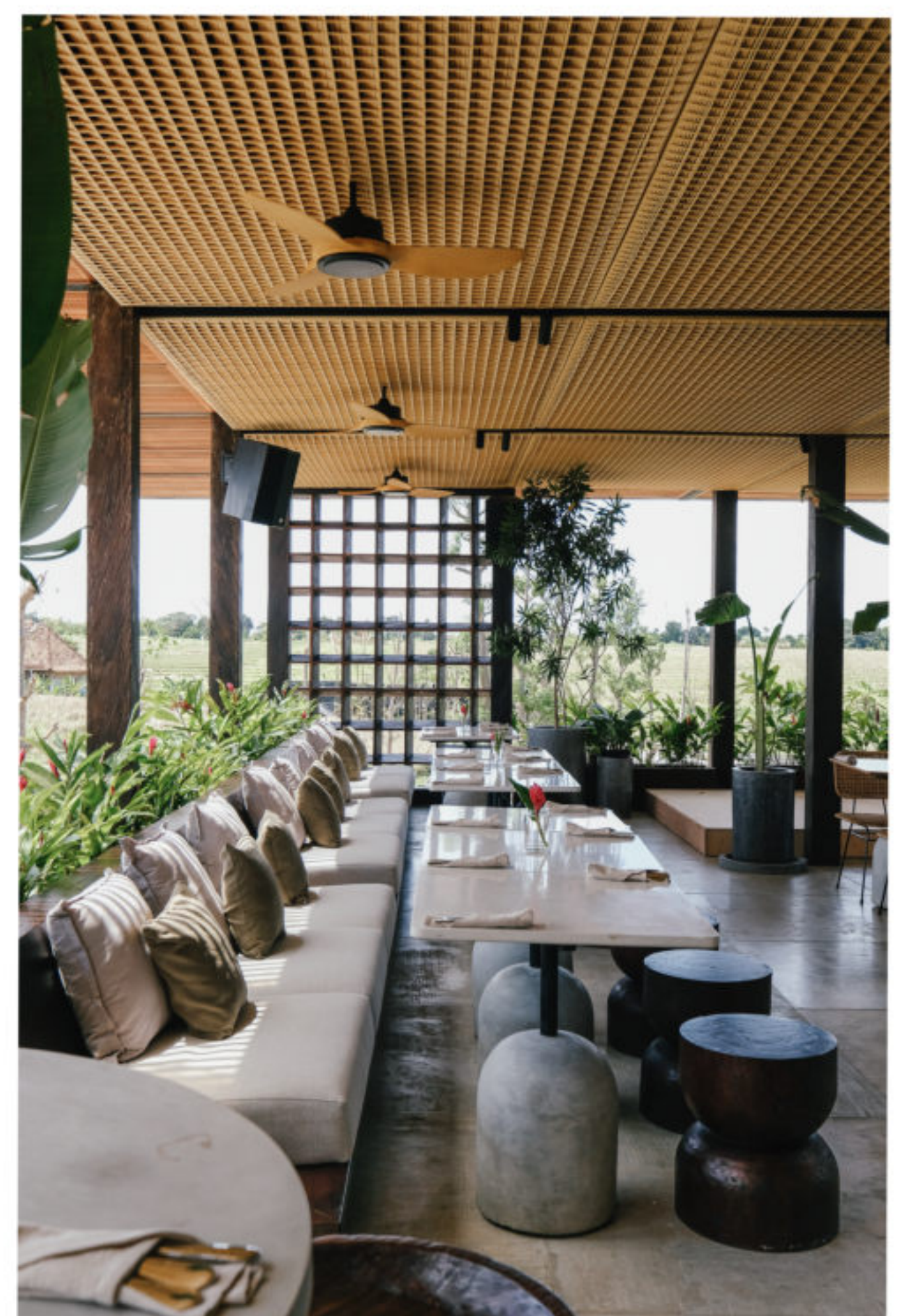

The café-bar-restaurant spans two floors, offering diverse experiences. As day turns to night, the rooftop becomes the perfect spot to enjoy the view. The rooftop mainly features a bar, but also includes a dining area with daybeds for relaxation.

The main dining space is designed to blend with nature, featuring abundant greenery that brings the outdoors inside. Hanging plants from the ceiling and large potted plants around the seating area create a vibrant and refreshing atmosphere. The ceiling design, dominated by rattan weaving mixed with wooden slats, serves as a shading accent that softens the natural light entering the interior.

Modern furniture, including rattan chairs, combines with natural wood and light-colored stone materials, adding to the rustic yet contemporary vibe. As night falls, the bar area exudes a warm and inviting ambiance. The bar walls, designed with organic shapes and textured rust, also function as wall shelves and visual attractions.



The store features an open layout, with several loose displays in the center of the space. The design concept and material choices maintain a cohesive connection with the restaurant area, ensuring a unified experience throughout.

In the pool area, there are five cabanas along with daybeds. Visitors can swim, relax in the cabanas, and enjoy food while taking in the serene views of the rice fields.

The spaces are open and airy, with plenty of natural light filtering in, enhancing the connection between the interior and the surrounding Pererenan rice fields.
